Rector retiring

PRCTURED with his wife Anne is Canon John Fitch who retires as Rector of Monks Eleigh with Chelsworth and Brent Eleigh with Milden at the end of the month.

Canon Fitch has spent the whole of his in-year ministry in Suffolk hut now plans to hop over the border into Essex to retire to his new home at Great Yeldham.

Born at Mistley, Canon Fitch was a student at Cambridge University where he gained a degree in history and thealogy before going on to train for the ministry at Wells Theological College.

Ordained in 1917, he became curate to
All Saints, Newmarket, before taking up
his first living as Vicar of Reydon from
1921 to 1920. During his 32-year stay he

also became chaptain to St Felix School.

Prior to his current post, Canon Fitch was Rector of Brandon and Santon Downham for ten years, He was made a canon in 1925 and became rural dean of Mildenhall in 1928.

Canon Fitch has been Rector at Monks Eleigh for the past six and a half years and concludes his ministry in the parishes on June 20.
