## Suffolk celebrates fine fare

THE best of Suffolk food and drink - whether dining out or eating at home - was celebrated yesterday at the 2007 EADT Suffolk Food & Drink Awards.

More than 100 guests from across the food, drink and hospitality sectors attended the lunchtime ceremony at The West Wing at Ickworth House, near Bury St Edmunds, with the presentation ceremony accompanied by a meal with a strong Suffolk theme.

The awards, being staged for the second time by EADT Suffolk magazine and again with the support of Southwold-based Adnams plc as overall sponsor, were this year expanded to a total of eight categories, to recognise the hard work and commitment that goes into producing, sourcing and supplying the fine food and drink available across the county.

In the eating-out categories, the Best Restaurant title this year went to The Leaping Hare at Wyken Hall, Stanton, the Best Dining Pub accolade was won by The Swan at Monks Eleigh and the Best Tea/Coffee Shop category was won by the National Trust at Dunwich.

In the retail sector, Peakhill Farm Organics from Saxmundham was named Best Farm Shop, Lawsons Delicatessen in Aldeburgh won the Best Delicatessen category and Rolfes of Walsh-le-Willows took the Best Butcher award.

In the producer categories, the Marybelle/Suffolk Meadow business from Rendham won the Best Dairy Produce award and The Cake Shop in Woodbridge was named Best Baker.

The awards presentations were compered by Mark David of The Cooking Experience, based in Hadleigh. The full results were:
